The Greater Miami Youth Symphony

Since 1958, the Greater Miami Youth Symphony (GMYS) has been a cornerstone of Miami's thriving arts and culture scene. Over the years, the orchestra has seen and survived rough times – from recessions to the pandemic, we've remained strong because our community has surrounded us.

Our mission is to instill life-long values of discipline, teamwork, responsibility, respect, and cultural appreciation in young musicians while enriching the cultural foundation of our community by reaching out to and recruiting young musicians from different cultural, ethnic, and economic backgrounds.

The GMYS is an inclusive year-round, multi-tiered music training program consisting of over 600 students ranging in age from 5 to 18. GMYS offers beginning music classes on most instruments of the modern orchestra, as well as large ensembles which include 4 orchestras, 2 wind bands, and jazz bands. GMYS also boasts numerous small chamber groups including jazz combos which perform throughout Miami Dade County and a thriving summer camp program in 3 locations.

We understand how important it is to keep the music playing and the difference it makes in the lives of the many students we serve.



As a dynamic and diverse musician, violinist, and conductor, Huifang Chen enjoys a dual career as a performer and an educator. She graduated from the prestigious Curtis Institute of Music, where she studied violin with Jascha Brodsky. Mrs. Chen has been the Music Director of the Greater Miami Youth Symphony since 2008 and is currently the Concertmaster of the South Florida Symphony Orchestra. Mrs. Chen also teaches violin at the New World School of the Arts in Miami and at the Dreyfoos School of the Arts in Palm Beach. During the summers, she performs and teaches at the Killington Music Festival in Vermont. Mrs. Chen was a member of the Florida Philharmonic Orchestra from 1994 until its demise in 2003.

As a violin soloist, Mrs. Chen has appeared with many orchestras around the globe including the Taipei Symphony Orchestra in Taiwan and the Brno Philharmonic Orchestra in Czech Republic amongst others. Most recently, she played Mozart's Violin Concerto No. 5 "Turkish" with the South Florida Symphony Orchestra in 2020. She was the winner of the 1999 Young Concert Artist awarded by the National Concert Hall of Taipei, Taiwan, and a Concerto Competition Winner in 2003 at the University of Miami where she received her Master's degree in 2005.

As a committed violin pedagogue, many of Mrs. Chen's students are frequent winners at both local and international competitions. Many are now attending top music schools such as the Curtis Institute of Music and Juilliard School, and many others are now members of professional orchestras.

As a recording artist, she has appeared on dozens of award winning CDs for artists such as the Bee Gees, Natalie Cole, Gloria Estefan, Julio Iglesias, Ricky Martin, Jon Secada and Barbra Streisand. In 2012, she recorded Thomas Sleeper's Violin Concerto with the Brno Philharmonic Orchestra in the Czech Republic and the CD of this recording was released in 2014 on the Albany Label. Most recently, she was featured as a soloist in John Gottsch's Princess Yurievskaya CD with the South Florida Symphony Orchestra, which was released in 2021 on the Naxos Label.

The Alhambra Orchestra

Founded in 1990, the Alhambra Orchestra has as its purpose the promotion of live classical performances and of music education in Miami-Dade County. Its corporate entity, Alhambra Music, Inc., is a tax-exempt nonprofit operated and managed by volunteers who are also musicians. Thus, the orchestra has nominal administrative expenses and nearly all of its funding goes directly into programming. The orchestra has chosen to provide free concerts as much as possible, so that everyone in the community can experience its concerts without any barriers. The Alhambra Orchestra is wholly independent and not affiliated with any educational or civic institutions, although it often partners with other groups in our community. Funding comes from state and county grants, foundations, generous audience members, and the member musicians themselves, who are largely volunteers. Our highly trained musicians are diverse members of the community who earn their livings in many different occupations, but they all believe in the need for, and the power of, great music.

Hailed as an "Exemplary Leader" by the New York Times for leading members of New York Philharmonic and Manhattan School of Music in Carnegie Hall, violinist Daniel Andai has shared his versatile artistry as a soloist, recitalist, chamber musician, concertmaster, conductor and recording artist at major concert venues in over 50 countries. He is a prizewinner of numerous competitions and soloed with orchestras around the world.

Daniel Andai is concertmaster of Miami Symphony Orchestra (MISO) since 2010. Special solo appearances with MISO have included special induction ceremonies to Genius 100 Visionaries roster for JAXA Astronaut Soichi Noguchi while orbiting Earth aboard the International Space Station, Eduardo Marturet performing on a Holocaust surviving violin (part of the Violins of Hope collection), and actress Goldie Hawn. Previously, he was concertmaster of the Philharmonic Orchestra of the Americas in New York with whom he recorded multiple Billboard rated SONY Classical CD's and toured as soloist during Mexico's bicentennial celebrations for millions of viewers. He appeared as guest concertmaster with orchestras in Mexico, Brazil, Switzerland, and France, as a section violinist of New York Philharmonic and Miyazaki Festival Orchestra (Japan), and worked closely with members of major string quartets, symphony, opera, and ballet orchestras from around the world.

Dr. Daniel Andai is an educator and Chief Academic Officer as Dean of the Music Division at New World School of the Arts (Miami, Florida) where facilitates the partnership between Miami Dade College, University of Florida, and Miami Dade County Public Schools. He is Artistic Director of Killington Music Festival (Killington, Vermont), and Artistic Director and Principal Conductor of Alhambra Orchestra in Miami. Previously, he served as violin professor and Marialice Shivers Endowed Chair in Fine Arts at University of Texas in Edinburg and served on faculties at Miami-Dade College and New World School of the Arts. He has participated in over 30 summer music festivals, where he worked with countless world class pop and classical artists and toured extensively with the Verbier Festival Orchestra and Verbier Chamber Orchestra, where he served as a concertmaster.

Daniel Andai serves on boards and advisory boards, is a panelist for Jeb and Columba Bush's Arts4Life scholarship organization, and performed for numerous world dignitaries, including Hilary Clinton, Donald Trump, Lech Walesa, Al Gore, Benjamin Netanyahu, among others.

Daniel Andai is an alumnus of University of Miami, Manhattan School of Music, Lynn University, New World School of the Arts, Miami Dade College and Killington Music Festival.

Los programas se presentan en inglés, español y, a veces, en ambos. 
